A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA, PROCLAIMING NOVEMBER 21, 2019 AS "PANCREATIC AWARENESS DAY" IN NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA.

**WHEREAS**, the American Cancer Society estimates that in 2019, approximately 56,770 people will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer; and

**WHEREAS**, pancreatic cancer accounts for about 3% of all cancers in the United States and about 7% of all cancer deaths; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is hard to detect because the pancreas is deep inside the body so generally, individuals have no symptoms until the later stages, after the cancer has become very large or spread to other organs; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer has the lowest survival rate of all cancers; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2019, it is estimated that approximately 45,750 deaths will occur from pancreatic cancer; and

**WHEREAS**, the good health and well-being of the residents of Nassau County are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about pancreatic cancer and research into early detection, causes, and effective treatments.
