Discussion: Mr. Mullin explained that staff has had several meetings with the Sheriff's Office regarding criminal activity in the County associated with these facilities following Duval County adopting an ordinance to eliminate these facilities. Effective December 13, 2019, representatives from Code Enforcement, Building Department, and the Fire Marshal's office along with deputies will check all of these 32 internet gaming facilities for compliance with zoning, fire, and building codes. Mr. Mullin is in the process of drafting an ordinance to address nuisance complaints of these facilities based upon increased criminal activity. He will also be requesting the Board to set a special meeting before the end of the year to consider this ordinance and address the legal issues. Mr. Mullin advised that Nassau County must gather their own crime statistics to address a nuisance in this County. Chairman Taylor pointed out that since Duval County closed gaming establishments, the number of gaming establishments in Nassau County increased from 14 to 32.

Public input:

- Seber Newsome III came forward to speak in opposition to internet gaming facilities advising that they are a public nuisance and he requested the County shut them down.
- Ken Braddock leases property to two internet gaming facilities and each has a 24 hour armed guard and these establishments are not a nuisance. Numerous older people enjoy playing the games and socializing. He requested information on upcoming meetings regarding this issue.
- Jerry Bass owned one of the first game rooms in Nassau County since 2002 until 2009. He leased two buildings to gaming establishments recently and has had no problems. These rooms are a form of entertainment for senior citizens.
- James Taylor did not believe that these internet gaming facilities breed crime. Crime is bred at home.
- Lynn Hyatt expressed concerns with traffic and parking issues associated with the gaming establishments in Callahan. He agreed that crime has become a result of these facilities. In addition, they prey on those who

can least afford gaming who need their money to pay for necessities such as groceries and medications. They are opened in order to make money, not show benevolence. He added that if the County cannot make an absolute ban, they should make it as restrictive as possible.

• Kenny Farmer expressed concern with the traffic and crime associated with these internet gaming facilities. Now is the time to address this issue.

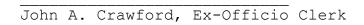
