He advised that the Board has tried numerous times to call Glen Mirkitch who requested a callback during the meeting.

Public input: Debra Manser, Cheers Horse Ranch and Amelia Island Horseback Riding, came forward to request that when the beaches reopen, that her horseback riding business have the ability to reopen and have access to the beach. Discussion followed.

Motion: Authorize County Manager to sign an executive order reopening the County beaches with the following regulations:

- 1. Effective 6:00 a.m. on May 1, 2020, the beaches within the unincorporated areas of Nassau County will be open.
- Vehicular traffic or vehicular parking on the wet and dry sand areas of the beach is not prohibited except for police and emergency vehicles, turtle

- patrol and other vehicles permitted by the County Manager.
- 3. Beaches will be open daily from 6:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m. The parking areas will be closed daily from 9:01 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.
- 4. The beach parking areas of Peters Point, Burney Park, Scott Road and the South End Walkover will be open daily from 6:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m. The aforementioned parking areas will be closed daily from 9:01 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.
- 5. All individuals allowed on the beach areas are subject to the restrictions and must adhere to the Center for Disease Control guidelines which include maintaining a six-foot distance between individuals and no gather of more than ten people.
- 6. No commercial or group sports activities shall be allowed on the beach.
- 7. No horses are allowed on the beach.
- 8. No horse trailers or truck larger than pick-up trucks are permitted in the parking areas set forth in Section 4 herein.
- 9. "Beach" is considered to mean the wet and dry sandy portions of the Atlantic Ocean beach in the unincorporated areas of Nassau County.
- 10. A violation of any provision will subject the violator to a second degree misdemeanor with a penalty of sixty days in jail and/or a \$500.00 fine.
- 11. Any vehicle that remains in the parking areas set forth herein after the hours established will subject the owner/operator to a second degree misdemeanor with a penalty of sixty days in jail and/or a \$500.00 fine.
- 12. This executive order shall expire at the expiration of the declaration of the Local State of Emergency.
- 13. In addition, Board to revisit allowing commercial horseback riding and other commercial activities at the beach at each seven-day renewal of the Local State of Emergency. Reinstating beach camping and driving will be addressed at a later date. Regarding American Beach, it was requested to install "local Access Only" signage for Julia and Lewis Streets and direct beach traffic down Burney Road.

<u>ss200429 - 6:45:17</u> Dr. Seidel provided an update regarding the COVID-19 pandemic. Currently, there is a case count of 54 residents. Of the 1,417 tests administered, 1,361 have tested negative. The hospital capacity has never been exceeded and the County has never had to go into Crisis Care mode. There are three patients currently in the hospital and 31 of the 54 residents have been released from isolation.

<u>ss200429 - 6:46:31</u> Director Foster provided his report noting that the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) continues to work hand in hand with the Health Department in assisting with the processes. His department continues with messaging for the public. As businesses begin to open, people still must remain vigilant in their attempts to minimize their risk of being infected or spreading the COVID-19 disease. Director Foster had no concerns about reopening the beach providing the public focuses on remaining safe.

<u>SS200429 - 6:48:58</u> Mr. Mullin thanked the City of Fernandina Beach for their input regarding the beach reopening. He advised that other beach communities only allow passive exercise on their beaches with no chairs, umbrellas, tents or towels permitted. He explained that Nassau County has a significant elderly population unable to walk the beach and could not comply with that requirement.
