Dear Chairman Leeper:

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") has reviewed the Nassau County proposed comprehensive plan amendment (Amendment No. 20-01ESR), received on January 23, 2020, pursuant to the expedited state review process in Section 163.3184(2)(3), Florida Statutes (F.S.). We have identified no comment related to adverse impacts to important state resources and facilities within the Department's authorized scope of review.

We are, however, providing a technical assistance comment consistent with Section 163.3168(3), F.S. The technical assistance comment will not form the basis of a challenge. It is offered either as a suggestion which can strengthen the County's comprehensive plan in order to foster a vibrant, healthy community or is technical in nature and designed to ensure consistency with the Community Planning Act in Chapter 163, Part II, F.S. The technical assistance comment is:

Technical Assistance Comment – Incorporation by Reference. Proposed **Policy WAT.06.03** of the Public Facilities Element (Potable Water Sub-Element) states, *The County's Water Supply Facilities Work Plan (2019-2030) is incorporated into the comprehensive plan as included as Technical Appendix "N"*. For clarity and to ensure consistency with section 163.3177(1)(b), Florida Statutes, regarding incorporation by reference, the County may want to consider modifying the policy as follows: *The County's Water Supply Facilities Work Plan (2019-2020) prepared by the Northeast Florida Regional Council, 2019, is incorporated into the comprehensive plan as <u>and</u> included as Technical Appendix "N".*

The County should act by choosing to adopt, adopt with changes, or not adopt the proposed amendment. For your assistance, we have enclosed the procedures for adoption and transmittal of the comprehensive plan amendment. In addition, the County is reminded that:

• Section 163.3184(3)(b), F.S., authorizes other reviewing agencies to provide comments directly to the County. If the County receives reviewing agency comments and they are not resolved, these comments could form the basis for a challenge to the amendment after adoption.

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- The second public hearing, which shall be a hearing on whether to adopt one or more comprehensive plan amendments, must be held within 180 days of your receipt of agency comments or the amendment shall be deemed withdrawn unless extended by agreement with notice to the Department and any affected party that provided comment on the amendment pursuant to Section 163.3184(3)(c)1., F.S.
- The adopted amendment must be rendered to the Department. Under Section 163.3184(3)(c)2. and 4., F.S., the amendment effective date is 31 days after the Department notifies the County that the amendment package is complete or, if challenged, until it is found to be in compliance by the Department or the Administration Commission.
