<u>ss200701 - 9:02:19</u> Dr. Seidel provided a COVID-19 pandemic update advising that as of this morning, there are 14 new cases, which brings the total resident count to 188. Out of the 188 cases, 100 of them were reported within the past two weeks. Currently, there are 2 patients with COVID-19 at Baptist Nassau. She advised that the demographics are reporting younger patients. The Department of Health (DOH) continues to schedule mobile COVID-19 drive-up/walk-up testing throughout the County.

Dr. Seidel responded to an email inquiry from Mr. Aiken explaining the testing and the low percentage of residents that are infected. She provided an explanation of the dashboard results and offered to provide a presentation in the future to help citizens understand the dashboard. She explained the difference the between COVID-19 and the flu.

#### COUNTY MANAGER BUSINESS:

<u>SS200701 - 9:21:42 (Tab B)</u> Discuss/consider on Beach Driving at Scott Road beach access.

**Discussion:** Mr. Mullin explained that the Scott Road beach access was closed to vehicular access for various reasons such as the economics, limited space, and the COVID-19 pandemic. Staff is researching plans to reopen the Scott Road beach access; however, there is no specific plan or accommodations to provide today. A special meeting will be scheduled if necessary once staff has a plan for beach parking at the Scott Road beach access.

Public Input: Wade Bell inquired whether staff has data from property owner's that are eligible to receive the passes and the number of vehicles going on the beach. Mr. Mullin stated that there are no out of county residents going on the beach where beach parking is allowed. Mr. Mullin responded to inquiries from Mr. Bell stating that individuals that own property in Nassau County but do not live here can go to the Tax Collector's office to receive a photo ID verifying that they own property in Nassau County and that county staff is not collecting data as to the number of individuals receiving said ID's.

<u>SS200701 - 9:28:04</u> Director Foster explained that his department continues increased messaging regarding face masks and the Center for Disease Control (CDC) information. There has been continued work with the Florida Department of Health including an order of additional testing kits from Florida Division of Emergency Management and a large quantity order of cloth face masks from the Department of Health and Human Service. With the assistance of faithbased, non-governmental, governmental, and business partners the masks are being provided throughout the community. As to date, there is a total of 250,000 cloth face masks, 50,000 will be provided to the Nassau County School District with the remaining 200,000 to be distributed within the community.

<u>SS200701 - 9:29:28 Expansion Item #1:</u> Discuss/consider the resolution for the mandatory use of face coverings in response to COVID-19.

**Discussion:** Mr. Mullin provided a brief overview of the expansion item. He explained that the meeting will recess in order for the Chairman, Mr. Pope and himself to attend a conference call at 10:00 a.m. with other local officials to discuss the mandatory use of face coverings. He also provided for the Board's review documentation from other counties in Florida that have addressed the use of face masks. Discussion followed.

They decided that there should be a joint effort between the City of Fernandina Beach and Nassau County due to the lines of demarcation could be confusing to individuals. It was also discussed whether the approach should be on a limited basis such as thirty days or less to see if there are any changes in the number of cases. Mr. Mullin advised that Martin County's Ordinance includes statutory penalty language and encourages utilization of the Surgeon General's Guidelines regarding masks and social distancing. Discussion ensued.
