## Audience Input: Agenda and Non-Agenda Items

<u>ss200826 - 9:01:11</u> Mr. Mullin advised that citizens wishing to speak to the Board live during meetings can attend via Zoom or can submit an email to <u>comments@nassaucountyfl.com</u> and for the individuals to provide their name and address. <u>SS200826 - 9:03:34</u> Dr. Eugenia Ngo-Seidel, Nassau County Health Department, came forward to provide a public health update related to Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). As of August 25, 2020, the County had a total of 1,522 positive cases of which 1,427 were residents. Public Health Department has released 354 cases under quarantine. There were 161 new cases last week of which 44 percent were a result of congregate long term care living. The percent positivity is 10.8 percent; however, the rate is closer to

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six percent without the congregate long term care centers. There are currently nine new hospital cases since last week and three additional deaths. Her message this week is to stay home if you are sick.

Dr. Seidel distributed the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) pamphlet "Considerations for Wearing Masks". She explained that the use of plastic face screens are considered eye protection and do not protect others from sneezes or coughs. In addition, the use of masks with valves is not recommended as droplets can escape through the valves. She promoted the use of masks inside. She reviewed upcoming testing sites.

<u>ss200826 - 9:05:59</u> Greg Foster, Emergency Management Director, came forward and stated in reference to COVID 19, they did a special last Friday, "Back to School During a Pandemic" which was well received. Emergency Management has an Information Call-In Line that begins this week for any questions on how to remain safe. Emergency Management continues to support the Florida Department of (FDOH) in their efforts. They support the continuance of the mask ordinance and they have cloth masks available. Emergency Management is receiving increased requests for the N-95 masks from assisted living centers and skilled nursing facilities and they have located a vendor. Testing is also being promoted daily and they continue to work with the School District on contingency plans. There are two tropical waves that came off Africa but are not expected to be a threat.

<u>SS200826 - 9:11:54 (Tab E)</u> Consider the extension of Executive Order No. 16, regarding mandatory wearing of face coverings.

Discussion: Mr. Mullin reviewed the mask mandate restrictions in Executive Order #16. A lengthy discussion followed regarding an exit strategy in the future to make masks optional but still protect the county's 88,000 residents until a vaccine is made available. It was noted that the School District dictates the COVID-19 precautions for schools.

Public input: Bo Hodges provided public input via Zoom. He agreed with finding an end to this mask mandate and pointed out that only 1.7 percent of the county's population has tested positive with only a .016 percent chance of dying of COVID-19. He felt that this mask mandate was a burden to the citizens and it was time to end the State of Emergency. Mr. Mullin explained that the Board can override any Emergency Order.
