Discussion: Mr. Mullin provided a brief history regarding the proposed draft ordinance. He stated that the draft ordinance references the Endangered Species Act (ESA) which controls the uses of beach in order to protect habitat, which are the sea turtles for Nassau. Mr. Mullin referenced several Counties in Florida that have Endangered Species Permits or Habitat Conservation Plan that are approved by the Federal Government. He advised that staff was directed to work in conjunction with the City of Fernandina Beach on the Endangered Species Permit and are currently working on securing a grant to fund it. He explained that in the interim, the County adopted emergency provisions that address certain requirements that would be addressed in an Endangered Species Permit. These provisions would restrict driving on the beach; camping; and bon fires during the turtle nesting season. Mr. Mullin advised that the State of Florida, Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, and the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) have indicated that these emergency provisions would address these requirements until the County can forward the application for the necessary permits. He commented that it was his intent to request that the Board schedule an additional public hearing because the draft ordinance is only good through October 31, 2020; therefore, the Board would have to figure out how to address the beach from November 1, 2020 through April 30, 2021. He explained the Mr. Mullin stated that the Board could Board's options. also address the beach parking.

Mr. Mullin read the following names into the record of people who sent e-mails or left voice mails related to the proposed beach ordinance:

- David Helmer, September 13, 2020 Expressed concerns of using the beach as a parking lot.
- Pamela Buncan, September 14, 2020 Requested to speak during the meeting to address concerns of traffic and the effects of increased growth on American Beach.
- Chris Venable, September 14, 2020 In favor of increasing restrictions on animals, vehicle access and other activities on the beach.
- Jan McKay, September 14, 2020 Expressed full support of the draft beach ordinance that was

- presented on July 7, 2020 and recommended one night a month designated for limited family camping.
- John Hebden, September 14, 2020 Recommended amending the definition of "beach buggy" to include golf carts parts.
- Rex Humbard, September 14, 2020 Expressed approval of the proposed draft beach ordinance.
- Liz Shipyan, September 14, 2020 Addressed concerns to the economic impact associated with beach driving; beach parking; and protecting the ecologically sensitive barrier island.
- Susan McCutcheon, September 14, 2020 Felt that beach driving should be further restricted and that there is ample parking for any vehicle at the Scott Road intersection with Atlantic Beach.
- John De Bartolo, September 14, 2020 Recommended amending the definition of "beach buggy" to include golf cart.
- Michael Huffman, September 14, 2020 Against collection of data requirement for vehicles owners to access the beach.
- Mark and Tracy Johnson, September 14, 2020 Expressed concerns with vehicular congestion, overcrowding and environmental impacts to the beach.
- Mary Duffy, September 14, 2020 Thanked the Board for eliminating beach driving in the unincorporated areas at night. This lead to an positive impact of increased sea turtle nests located at Peter's Point, Lewis Street and Scott Road.
- Bobby Greene, September 14, 2020 Against restricting beach access during daylight hours; however, expressed support for restricting driving at night on the beach.

Mr. Mullin stated that the final budget hearing will be heard on September 28, 2020 for consideration to adopt the Fiscal Year 2020/2021 Millage Rates and Budget. He pointed out that there is a provision in the budget for a security company to provide security on the beach.

Public input: David Darin came forward to suggest that the proposed beach ordinance included that both parking and camping should be consistent with the dates. Ronald Sterling came forward stating that he has been running a beach camp called Night Sanders Campers for over 21 years at the historic American Beach and addressed his concerns in the proposed beach ordinance for camping requirements including the required insurance policy. Pamela Duncan appeared via Zoom to express her concerns with increased traffic in her neighborhood and the effects of increased growth on American Beach.
