RS210208 - 6:03:54 Dr. Eugenia Ngo-Seidel, Nassau County Health Department, provided a health update related to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic. As of today, there have been 7,270 COVID-19 cases of which 6,871 are Nassau County residents and 399 non-Florida residents. The County is making progress with the percent positivity for January 31 through February 6, 2021 at 10.48 percent. The next mobile testing event is February 10, 2021 from 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. at the Journey Church in Yulee. Regarding the vaccine, currently 11,139 residents have been vaccinated. Dr. Seidel urged residents to get vaccinated when able and continue to follow Center for Disease Control guidelines and stay home if you are ill. Dr. Seidel responded to questions posed by the Board regarding the number of vaccinations, availability to other age groups, and the ability of the County to handle an increase in vaccine supplies.

RS210208 - 6:12:44 Greg Foster, Emergency Management Director, provided a health update related to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic. He provided an update on the vaccination process. The County has been receiving 975 vaccination doses per week; however, in the next few weeks, the number of vaccines will increase. The two local Publix Supermarkets continues to provide 100 doses per store per week. Director Foster stressed the importance of people to check their e-mail accounts to see their scheduled vaccine appointment. He added that other stores like Winn Dixie and Walmart will be coming online to become part of the retail pharmacy distribution.

- Thanked all staff working through all the issues the County has been facing with COVID-19 pandemic.
- Attended the Northeast Florida Regional Council (NEFRC) meeting and stated that there is a Senate Bill SB62 going through the Florida Senate which, if passed, would remove all regional planning councils in the State of Florida. He was in opposition to this bill. The County Manager will draft a resolution from

the Nassau County Board of County Commissioners in support of the NEFRC and in opposition to Senate Bill 62 and bring back on February 11, 2021. Mr. ne will provide fact sheets and legislative background on this bill.

• Regarding the NEFRC, Commissioner Martin stated that there was a suggestion from the City of Fernandina Beach, as a Municipality appointment, to open up representation on the NEFRC from the Towns of Callahan and Hilliard Town Councils. Amy Bell, Administrative Manager, came forward to explain that to date, the Town of Hilliard did not have any Town Council member wishing to serve; however, they will ask again. The Town of Callahan explained that they will present this item at their next Town Council meeting.

## RS210208 - 6:36:24 Commissioner Gray's Business:

- Thanked the directors of Public Works and Road Department for handling the many recent calls.
- This Board requested Planning Department staff and the Planning and Zoning Board to review and bring back zoning changes to the Land Development Code (LDC) similar to the City of Fernandina Beach for the unincorporated areas of Amelia Island. On February 2, 2021, the Planning and Zoning Board met and denied the request for zoning district changes. He requested that this Board research the LDC Ordinance 97-19, Article 13, Section 13.06, which deals with zoning and height restrictions. In his opinion, a decrease in the height limit would harm the island's sensitive environment by increasing lot coverage allowed by one third; a change may infringe on a citizen's private property rights; and may limit economic development prosperity by reducing taxable revenue.
