Nassau County Community Involvement

As a Consultant, with the firm Michael Langton & Associates, I was solely assigned as Contract Consultant to Nassau County, during the FY 2001, with responsibilities of researching various funding sources and grant writing. These are some of the projects that I became involved:

Researched and developed applications for the following:

- A \$500,000 grant that provided partial funding for renovation of the Nassau County Historic Courthouse
- An application for partial funding of the Nassau County Emergency Management Center amount of \$300,000 [funding was not received during my tenure]
- A proposal for a Recreational Park, at the old Pogo Plant Property, with a floating dock
- An application to create the John Muir passive park [funding was awarded after my tenure; procurement of the property, by Nassau County, had not been finalized at application submittal time]
- Researched the old Florida Welcome Station located in Boulogne; the work not finished.

American Beach Neighborhood Involvement

As a Volunteer, property owner, member of the American Beach Property Owner Association Board, and for one year - President of the ABPOA Board, my community involvement has been extensive:

- Developed a successful application to the Florida Division of Historical Resources for the creation of a Neighborhood Survey of American Beach. That survey was the impetus and a prerequisite for American Beach to be named a Historic District and eventually listed in The National Register of Historic Places – 2002. Also recruited Historic Planner, Joel McEachern, to lead the project.
- Developed an application for partial renovation and preservation of historic Evans Rendezvous. Federal Housing and Urban Development provided the grant. I had to collaborate with Nassau County (the new owner of the facility) to use the grant funds for 'moth balling' the structure. Funding awarded was \$247,500.
- Wrote two (2) separate grant applications to the Florida Division of Forestry for purpose of providing Street Scaping along Lewis and Julia Streets (American Beach). Palm and Oak trees were planted and initially maintained.
- The original idea of building a Community Center in American Beach was that of Ruth Waters. After doing research by reaching out to the Northeast Florida Regional Planning Council, it was learned that the Florida Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG) may have funds that could help support development of a Community Center. After collaborating with Nassau County Officials, a request was made and close to \$300,000 were awarded for the project. With much more planning, several years with no progress, but eventually two unrelated groundbreakings were held, and the American Beach Community Center idea became a reality.
- With only one pavilion at Burney Park, without electricity, Ruth Waters discussed with the County Commissioner, District 2, for replacement of the older pavilion for two or three new, upgraded pavilions. However, only one replacement pavilion was constructed – albeit an improvement.
- The first Historic Marker erected in American Beach, on Lewis Street, was the result of Ruth Waters writing a Matching Grant application that was funded, by the Florida Division of Historic Resources.

American Beach Woman makes history herselt

HEATHER A PERRY News-Leader American Beach resident Ruth Waters McKay was among an elite group of women honored March 17 by Jacksonville Mayor Alvin Brown at the Women's History Month Breakfast. McKay was recognized for her many years of commitment and dedication to worthwhile projects in and for the community.

Other notable women lauded at the University of North Florida's Student Union were Judge Susan Black and Dr. Margarita Cabral-Maly.

Brown was on hand to address the women who were being celebrated for their significant contributions to the Jacksonville community and adjacent counties, and for acting as role models for young women.

McKay has made significant contributions in both Jacksonville and Nassau County, but was surprised when Roshanda Jackson, who chairs Mayor Brown's Committee on the Status of Women, called her with the news that

she was a finalist.

"I was simply floored. I have never given thought about what I have done over the years, nor did I ever think that someone would notice me and the work that I do – on the job or as a volunteer. But I was wrong: people noticed!"

McKay has been active in the
Jacksonville community since 1974,
serving as an aide to three of its mayors – Hans Tanzler, Jake M. Goldbold
and Tommy Hazouri.

With a background in accounting at Florida A&M University and the University of North Florida, McKay specialized in grantsmanship for Tanzler, and continued her service to the city in various capacities under subsequent administrations.

She served as past president for the League of Women Voters of Jacksonville, the Jacksonville section of the National Council of Negro Women, the Girls Clubs of Jacksonville and Bold City Chapter of the Links.

yor Dedicated to improving the life of sof seniors, McKay initiated the idea of hat swipe cards to account for units of ser-

vice provided to seniors by the city of Jacksonville. She developed the first Senior Services Directory and the first application for the Jacksonville Senior Citizen of the Year.

McKay has also been committed to working with Nassau County for many years.

An American Beach property owner since the early '80s who has resided in the historic beachside community since 1997, McKay contributed significantly to the sustainability of her hometown by obtaining the initial funds necessary for construction of the Community Center.

"I worked under contract for one year as a grants writer for Nassau County. During that time, I wrote a \$350,000 grant to renovate the Nassau County Courthouse located on Centre Street. During the ranking of applications in Tallahassee, members of the Museum were present and helped to not only get the application funded, but got the award increased to \$500,000."

an Emergency Management Center was awarded, but McKay believes that, at the time, the infrastructure was not in place.

"Again, I worked with the local historic preservationist group to obtain funding for the John Muir Ecological Park, located on State Road 200. The grant had to be awarded a year later due to an issue pertaining to the property.'

She also raised \$95,000 for the palms and crape myrtle trees that beautify the streets of American Beach, obtained funds to restore the exterior of the historic Evans Rendezvous and for the first historic marker for American Beach and was instrumental, along with Beach Lady and others, in helping to make the dream of an American Beach Community Center come true.

McKay also obtained funds for a survey grant that led to

American Beach's placement on the National Register of Historic Places and obtained a grant to restore the exterior of the Evans Rendezvous where Cab Calloway, Joe Louis, Ray Charles and others entertained.

"I am still amazed at the number of things I've accomplished, but at 71, I still love being involved in civic work for the betterment of people's lives," she said.

McKay has retired three times but can't seem to sit back and do nothing, despite earning that privilege.

"Why would I just do nothing? It's boring just sitting here! And I thought I had a lot to offer, still," she added.

She does contract compliance with the city of Jacksonville part-time now and this work fulfills her need to keep busy.

'I like the freedom and flexibility," she said.

American Beach has been a source of joy and a place of con-



tentment for McKay since she was a little girl visiting there with her parents. And as long as there remains work to do, she's ready to pitch in and get it done on behalf of the special place she calls home.




