**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA, ABANDONING THOSE CERTAIN RIGHTS OF
WAYS OR THE RENOUNCING AND DISCLAIMING OF ANY RIGHT OR
INTEREST IN A PORTION OF ROAD RIGHT OF WAY OF DEERFIELD
COUNTY CLUB ROAD, NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA**

WHEREAS, Kenneth L. Greene, Sr. is the qualified fee simple landowner of the following described property:

**Lands described in the legal description attached hereto as Exhibit “A”
and by this reference made a part hereof**

and;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners is authorized to adopt a resolution abandoning and disclaiming any right or interest to those certain rights-of-way or alleys pursuant to Section 177.101, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the application of Kenneth L. Greene, Sr., herein referred to as Applicant, was duly presented to the Board of County Commissioners at its regular meeting on May 24, 2021 in order to set a public hearing; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on June 28, 2021 by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, it appears that the Applicant is the fee simple landowner of the above-described property maintained by Nassau County and its successors. The right-of-way does not serve a public purpose and the Board of County Commissioners has no objections to abandonment of the right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, notice was published in accordance with the requirements of Section 177.101(4), Florida Statutes, and all state and county taxes due and payable assessed against the owner of the lands to be abandoned have been paid in full; and

WHEREAS, a notice of intention to apply to the Board of County Commissioners to abandon the right-of-way was duly published in a newspaper of general circulation in Nassau County, Florida, on June 9, 2021 and June 16, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, in accordance with Section 177.101(3), Florida Statutes, has determined that abandoning the right-of-way will not affect the ownership or right of convenient access of persons owning other parts of the subdivision or adjacent properties, and is in the best interest of the public welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, that:

1. Recitals. The above recitals are true and are incorporated as legislative findings.
2. Abandonment. Upon request of Applicant, the Board finds that the right-of-way described within Exhibit "A" located within Nassau County, Florida is hereby abandoned insofar as this Board of County Commissioners has the authority to do so and this Board hereby renounces and disclaims any right of the County and the public in and to the described property.
3. The Board, based on the abandonment, shall not be responsible for the maintenance or repair of the right-of-way described within Exhibit "A".
4. This Resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida, and said Applicant shall publish a notice of its adoption one (1) time within thirty (30) days hereafter in a newspaper of general circulation in Nassau County, Florida.
