ANY DISCREPANCY SHALL BE REPORTED IMMEDIATELY TO THE DESIGN CONSULTANT FOR REVIEW AND CORRECTION. THE GENERAL CONTRACTOR SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE GENERAL CONTRACTOR'S SITE ENGINEERING COORDINATE IN PLUMBING PLANS.

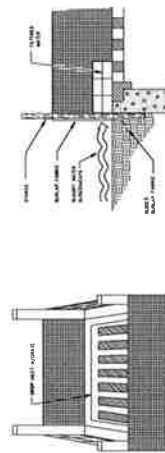


EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL NOTES

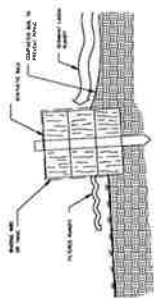
1. THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (EPA) HAS ISSUED TO FLORIDA A NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) COVERED PERMIT FOR STORMWATER DISCHARGE. THIS NPDES PERMIT REQUIRES THAT THE ACTUATOR OF CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES INVOLVED ARE CERTAIN CERTIFICATION, NOTIFICATION, INSPECTION, AND RECORD KEEPING IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE EPA PUBLICATION EPA 823-B-80-001, "NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMITTING REGULATIONS FOR CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES". THE ACTUATOR OF CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES (BMP) TO PREVENT POLLUTION FROM CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES. IT IS THE CONTRACTOR'S RESPONSIBILITY TO DETERMINE IF THE PROJECT QUALIFIES FOR NPDES APPLICATION AND NOTIFICATION AND, IF NECESSARY, PREPARE, SUBMIT AND MAINTAIN THE REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE EPA GUIDELINES AND REGULATIONS.
2. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL INDICATE THE MINIMUM EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL MEASURES REQUIRED FOR THIS PROJECT. THE CONTRACTOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR MEETING ALL APPLICABLE RULES, REGULATIONS AND WATER QUALITY GUIDELINES AND MAY NEED TO INSTALL ADDITIONAL CONTROLS.
3. THE CONTRACTOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR FOLLOWING THE BEST EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL PRACTICES AS OUTLINED IN THE PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS, AND THE CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT DISTRICT PERMIT AND REGULATIONS. DRAINAGE PUMPS SHALL NOT EXCEED THE CAPACITY OF THE DRAINAGE SYSTEM.
4. ALL EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL MEASURES SHALL BE DONE IN A MANNER TO MINIMIZE WATER POLLUTION AND POLLUTION. DISCHARGE SHALL BE CONTROLLED AND REQUIRED THROUGH HAY FILTERS, SILTATION DAPERS AND SUMPS. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE PREVENTION, CORRECTION, CONTROL, AND ABATEMENT OF EROSION AND WATER POLLUTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 17-2, FLORIDA STATUTES, AND THE BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES (BMP) FOR CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE PROTECTION OF SOUND LAND AND WATER MANAGEMENT FROM THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION, CHAPTER 6.
5. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PAY FOR ANY WATER QUALITY CONTROL VIOLATIONS FROM ANY AGENCY THAT RESULTS IN FINES BEING ASSESSED TO THE OWNER BECAUSE OF THE CONTRACTOR'S FAILURE TO ELIMINATE TURBID RUNOFF FROM LEAVING THE SITE AND BAKING BACKGROUND LEVELS. EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL BARRIERS SHALL BE PLACED ADJACENT TO ALL WETLAND AREAS WHERE THERE IS POTENTIAL FOR DOWNSTREAM WATER QUALITY DEGRADATION.
6. QUALITY DEGRADATION

7. ADDITIONAL PROTECTION FOR EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL DURING CONSTRUCTION SHALL BE PROVIDED THAT WILL NOT PERMIT POLLUTANTS TO ENTER THE "PROTECTED" DRAINAGE TO A DOWNSTREAM RECEIVING BODY.
8. WIRE MESH SHALL BE PLACED OVER THE DROP INLET SO THAT THE WIRE EXTENDS A MINIMUM OF 1 FOOT BEYOND EACH SIDE OF THE INLET STRUCTURE. HARDWARE CLOTH OR COMPARABLE WIRE MESH WITH 1/2-INCH OPENINGS SHALL BE USED. IF MORE THAN ONE STRIP OF MESH IS NECESSARY, THE STRIPS SHALL BE OVERLAPPED. FOOT NO COARSE AGGREGATE SHALL BE PLACED OVER THE WIRE MESH. THE DEPTH OF STONE SHALL BE AT LEAST 12 INCHES OVER THE ENTIRE INLET OPENING. THE STONE SHALL EXTEND BEYOND THE INLET OPENING AT LEAST 12 INCHES ON ALL SIDES.
9. IF THE STONE FILTER BECOMES CLOGGED WITH SEDIMENT SO THAT IT NO LONGER ADEQUATELY PERFORMS ITS FUNCTION, THE STONES MUST BE PULLED AWAY FROM THE INLET, CLEANED AND REPLACED.
10. BALES SHALL BE PLACED LENGTHWISE IN SINGLE ROW SURROUNDING THE INLET, WITH THE ENDS OF ADJACENT BALES PRESSED TOGETHER. BALES SHALL BE EITHER WIRE-BOUND OR STRING-TIED WITH THE BINDINGS ORIENTED AROUND THE SIDES RATHER THAN OVER AND UNDER THE BALE.
11. THE FILTER BARRIER SHALL BE EXTENDED AND BACKFILLED. A TRENCH SHALL BE EXCAVATED TO A MINIMUM DEPTH OF 8 INCHES. AFTER THE BALE ARE STAKED, THE EXCAVATED SOIL SHALL BE BACKFILLED AND COMPACTED AGAINST THE FILTER BARRIER. EACH BALE SHALL BE BENTONITE WALLED TO PREVENT FLOW OF WATER FROM ENTERING BETWEEN BALES.
12. SED SHALL BE PLACED IN AREAS WHICH MAY REQUIRE IMMEDIATE EROSION PROTECTION TO ENSURE WATER QUALITY STANDARDS AND SHALL BE MAINTAINED UNTIL COMPLETION OF ALL CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES.
13. CONTRACTOR SHALL ENSURE THAT ALL DRAINAGE STRUCTURES, PILES, ETC. ARE CLEANED OUT AND WORKING PROPERLY AT ALL TIMES AND THE STRUCTURE SHALL BE INSPECTED AFTER EACH RAINFALL EVENT AND REPAIRS, AS NEEDED, SHALL BE MADE IMMEDIATELY.
14. ANY DISCHARGE FROM A DRAINAGE ACTIVITY SHALL BE FILTERED AND CONVEYED TO THE OUTFALL IN A MANNER WHICH PREVENTS EROSION AND THE TRANSPORTATION OF SUSPENDED SOLIDS TO THE RECEIVING OUTFALL.
15. SILT FENCES AND FILTER BARRIERS SHALL BE INSPECTED IMMEDIATELY AFTER EACH RAINFALL AND AT LEAST DAILY DURING PROLONGED RAINFALL. ANY REQUIRED REPAIRS SHALL BE MADE IMMEDIATELY.
16. NECESSARY REPAIRS TO BARRIERS OR REPLACEMENT OF BALES SHALL BE ACCOMPLISHED PROMPTLY. CLOSE ATTENTION SHALL BE PAID TO THE REPAIR OF DAMAGED BALES, END RIGGS AND UNDERSTANDING BENTONITE BALES.
17. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL MAINTAIN THE BARRIERS IN SUCH A MANNER THAT LEAVES THE SITE AND CHANGES ANY DOWNSTREAM CONDITIONS BY RAISING, BOTTOMS AND/OR CLOSING OUTFALL CLOSURES.
18. SEDIMENT DEPOSITS TO BE REMOVED AFTER EACH RAINFALL AND REMOVED WHEN THE LEVEL OF SEDIMENT REACHES APPROXIMATELY ONE-HALF THE HEIGHT ON THE BARRIER. SEDIMENT TANKS TO BE RESTORED TO THEIR ORIGINAL DIMENSIONS BY REMOVING THE SEDIMENT WHEN IT HAS ACCUMULATED TO ONE-THIRD THE DESIGN DEPTH OF THE TRAP. REMOVED SEDIMENT TO BE DEPOSITED IN A SUITABLE AREA AND MANNER THAT IT WILL NOT REERODE.
19. ANY SEDIMENT DEPOSITS REMAINING IN PLACE AFTER THE SILT FENCE, SYNTHETIC BALE OR FILTER BARRIER IS NO LONGER REQUIRED OR AFTER COMPLETION OF CONSTRUCTION SHALL BE DRESSED TO CONFORM WITH THE EXISTING GRADE, PREPARED AND SEED.
20. THE SITE CONTRACTOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR REMOVING THE TEMPORARY EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL DEVICES AFTER COMPLETION OF CONSTRUCTION AND ONLY WHEN AREAS HAVE BEEN STABILIZED. ALL DEMATERING EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL TO REMAIN IN PLACE AFTER COMPLETION OF CONSTRUCTION AND REMOVED ONLY WHEN ALL DISTURBED AREAS HAVE BEEN STABILIZED.
21. ALL DISTURBED AREAS SHALL BE STABILIZED THROUGH COMPACTION, GRASSING AND SEEDING. THE GRASS/SEEDING SHALL BE MAINTAINED UNTIL PERMANENT VEGETATIVE COVER IS ESTABLISHED AT ALL SLOPES 4:1 OR GREATER TO RECEIVE SHARP SOILS 5:0.

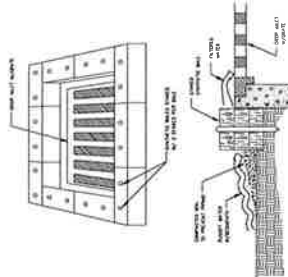

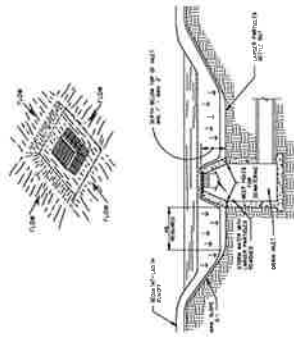
BURLAP DROP INLET SEDIMENT FILTER



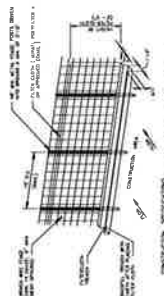
SYNTHETIC BALE BARRIER



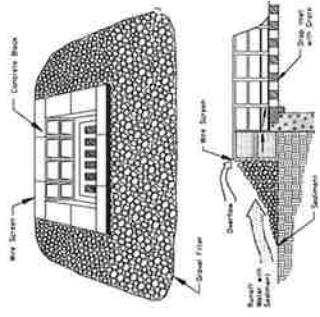
SYNTHETIC BALE DROP INLET SEDIMENT FILTER



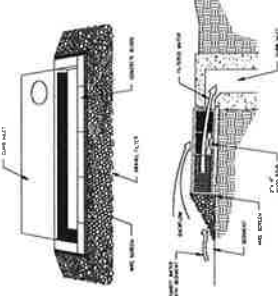
EXCAVATED DROP INLET SEDIMENT TRAP

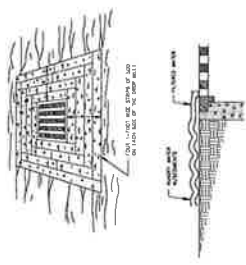
BLOCK & GRAVEL DROP INLET SEDIMENT FILTER



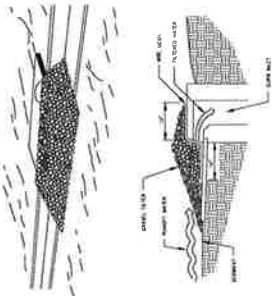
BLOCK & GRAVEL CURB INLET SEDIMENT FILTER



GRAVEL & WIRE MESH DROP INLET SEDIMENT FILTER

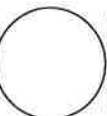
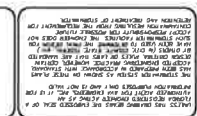


SOD DROP INLET SEDIMENT FILTER

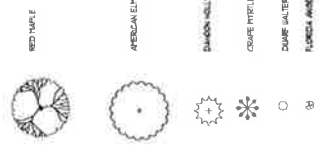

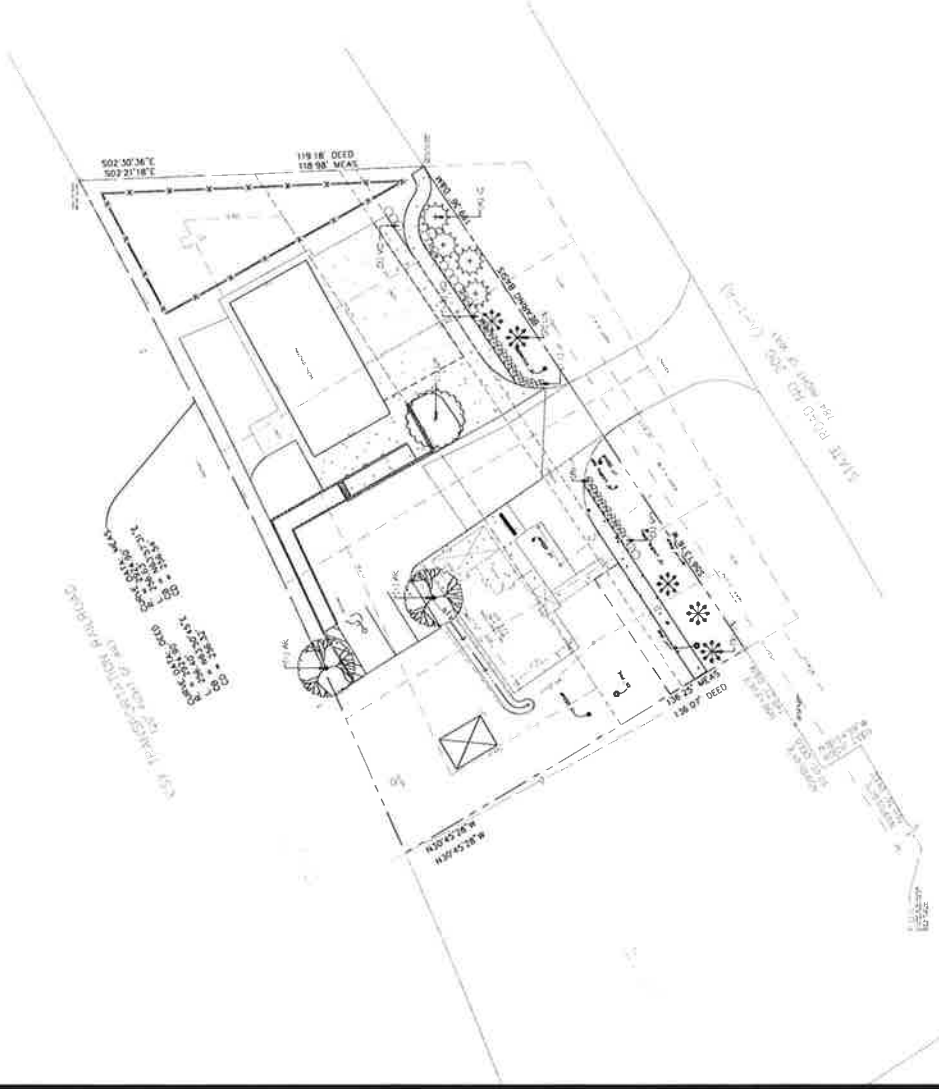

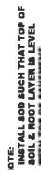
1. Prior to construction the landscape contractor shall be responsible for locating all underground utilities and shall avoid damage to all utilities during the construction of the landscape. The landscape contractor is responsible for repairing any cost and/or damage to the utilities, water, sewer, gas, telephone, electric, cable, etc., which occurs as a result of the landscape construction.

2. When conditions detrimental to plant growth are encountered, such as rubble and/or debris, the landscape contractor shall remove the same and replace with suitable conditions of plant growth, using owner's representative for approval.

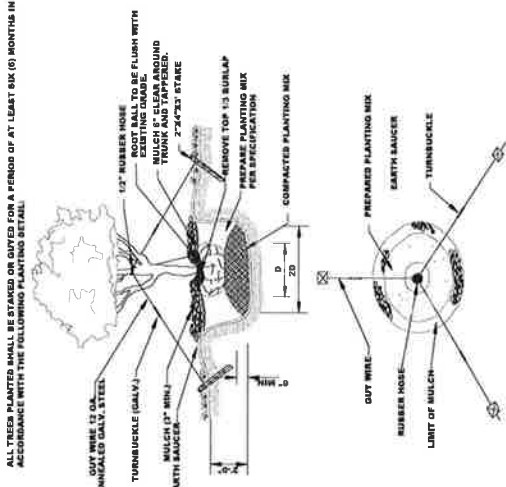
3. All plants must be healthy, vigorous material, free of pests and diseases, and must be of the highest quality. Plants must be selected from the Florida Plant Database for Nursery Plants (parts one and two), available through Florida Dept. of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

4. All plants must be supplied by a nursery approved by the Landscape Architect before they are installed in the landscape.

5. NO SUBSTITUTIONS WITHOUT PRIOR WRITTEN CONSENT OF THE LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT.
6. ALL TREES AND PLANTS SHALL MEET MINIMUM SPECIFIED SIZES IN INCHES AND FEET REGARDLESS OF CONTAINER SIZE.
7. IF ANY PLANT DEATHS DO OCCUR, THE LARGER SPECIFICATION SHALL PREVAIL.
8. ALL CALIPER SIZES MUST BE MET.
9. CONTRACTOR TO VERIFY ALL QUANTITIES.
10. NEW LANDSCAPING SHOULD NOT INCLUDE MORE THAN FIFTY (50) PERCENT OF ANY ONE GENUS OR TWENTY-FIVE (25) PERCENT OF ANY ONE SPECIES.
