#### **CONTRACT FOR LIMEROCK MATERIAL**

THIS CONTRACT entered into on	, by and between the
BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONE	RS OF NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA, a political
subdivision of the State of Florida, here	cinafter referred to as the "County", and LIBERTY
TRUCKING LLC, located at 9678 FL-12	1, Lake Butler, FL 32054; and whose mailing address
is P.O. Box 626, Lake Butler FL 32054, he	reinafter referred to as the "Vendor".

**WHEREAS**, the County received sealed bids for Limerock Material, Bid No. NC22-038R-ITB, on December 22, 2022 at 10:00 AM; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Works has determined that the Vendor was the lowest, most responsive and responsible bidder. A copy of the Vendor's Response Price Sheet is attached hereto as Attachment "A" and made a part hereof; and

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the terms and conditions herein set forth, the County and the Vendor agree as follows:

#### SECTION 1. Description of Services and/or Materials to be Provided

The County does hereby retain the Vendor to provide the services and/or materials further described in the *Technical Specifications* a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Attachment "B". This Contract standing alone does not authorize the performance of any work or require the County to place any orders for work. The Vendor shall commence the work in accordance with the issuance of a written Notice to Proceed for services and/or materials issued by the County.

#### SECTION 2. Receiving/Payment/Invoicing

No payment will be made for services and/or materials without proper County authorization and approval. The County shall pay the Vendor pursuant to Attachment "A" and Vendor's Response Sheet an amount not to exceed \$3,000,000.00 within forty-five (45) calendar days of receipt and acceptance of invoice by the Director of Public Works, pursuant to and in accordance with the promulgations set forth by the State of Florida's Prompt Payment Act. (Florida Statutes Section 218.70). The Vendor shall also submit a copy of all invoices submitted to Public Works for payment to <a href="mailto:invoices@nassaucountyfl.com">invoices@nassaucountyfl.com</a>. Payment shall not be made until services and/or materials have been received, inspected and accepted by the County in the quantity and/or quality ordered. Payment will be accomplished by submission of an invoice, with the contract

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number referenced thereon. Payment in advance of receipt of services and/or materials by the County cannot be made.

The invoice submitted shall be in sufficient detail as to item, quantity and price in order for the County to verify compliance with the awarded bid.

#### SECTION 3. Acceptance of Services and/or Materials

Receipt of services and/or materials shall <u>not</u> constitute acceptance. Final acceptance and authorization of payment shall be given only after a thorough inspection indicates that the services and/or materials meet bid specifications and conditions. Should the quantity and/or quality differ in any respect from specifications, payment will be withheld until such time as the Vendor takes necessary corrective action. If the proposed corrective action is not acceptable to the County, the County Manager's Office may authorize the recipient to refuse final acceptance of the quantity and/or quality received. Should a representative of the County agree to accept the services and/or materials on condition that the Vendor will correct their performance within a stipulated time period, then payment will be withheld until said corrections are made.

#### **SECTION 4. Firm Prices**

Prices for services and/or materials covered in the specifications of this Contract shall remain firm for the period of this Contract pursuant to pricing as reflected in Attachment "A"; net delivered to the ordering agency, **F.O.B. DESTINATION**. No additional fees or charges shall be accepted.

#### **SECTION 5. Fuel Surcharge**

If Vendor's verified price for diesel fuel purchased to fulfill the terms of this contract at any time exceeds \$5.00 per gallon, Vendor shall charge the County and the County shall pay to Vendor a surcharge fee in accordance with Attachment "A". If County audit of the Contract determines that Vendor's price for diesel fuel purchased to fulfill the terms of this contract at any time was less than \$5.00 per gallon and County was charged a surcharge fee, Vendor shall refund to County the surcharge fee. The fuel surcharge adjustments described in this paragraph shall be supported by time of purchase vouchers. Invoices from Vendor to County and refunds to County from Vendor pursuant hereto shall be completed by not later than September 30<sup>th</sup> each year.

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#### **SECTION 6. Fund Availability**

This Contract is deemed effective only to the extent that appropriations are available. Pursuant to Florida Statutes, all appropriations lapse at the end of the Fiscal Year. Multi-year awards may be adequately funded but the County reserves the right not to appropriate for an ongoing procurement if it is deemed in its best interest.

#### **SECTION 7. Expenses**

Vendor shall be responsible for all expenses incurred while performing the services under this Contract. This includes, without limitation, license fees, memberships and dues; automobile and other travel expenses; meals and entertainment; insurance premiums; and all salary, expenses and other compensation paid to Vendor's agents, if any, hired by Vendor to complete the work under this Contract.

#### **SECTION 8. Taxes and Liens**

The Vendor recognizes that the County, by virtue of its sovereignty, is not required to pay any taxes on the services or goods purchased under the terms of this Contract. As such, the Vendor will refrain from including taxes in any billing. The Vendor is placed on notice that this exemption generally does not apply to nongovernmental entities, contractors, or subcontractors. Any questions regarding this tax exemption should be addressed to the County Manager.

The Vendor acknowledges that property being improved that is titled to the County, is not subject to lien of any kind for any reason. The Vendor shall include notice of such exemptions in any subcontracts and purchase orders issued under this Contract.

#### **SECTION 9. Laws Governing this Contract**

This Contract shall be consistent with, and be governed by, the Ordinances of Nassau County, the whole laws and rules of the State of Florida, both procedural and substantive, and applicable federal statutes, rules and regulations. Any and all litigation arising under this Contract shall be brought in Nassau County, Florida. Any mediation, pursuant to litigation, shall occur in Nassau County, Florida.

#### SECTION 10. Changes

The County reserves the right to order, in writing, changes in the work within the scope of the Contract, such as change in quantity or delivery schedule. The Vendor has the right to request

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an equitable price adjustment in cases where changes to the Contract under the authority of this clause result in increased costs to the Vendor.

#### **SECTION 11. Modifications**

In addition to modifications made under the changes clause, this Contract may be modified within the scope of the Contract upon the written and mutual consent of both parties, and approval by appropriate legal authority in the County.

#### **SECTION 12. Assignment & Subcontracting**

In order to assign its Contract with the County, or to subcontract any of the work requirements to be performed, the Vendor must ensure, and provide assurances to the County upon request, that any subcontractor selected for work under this Contract has the necessary qualifications and abilities to perform in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Contract. The Vendor must provide the County with the names of any subcontractor considered for work under this Contract; the County reserves the right to reject any subcontractor whose qualifications or performance, in the County's judgement, are insufficient. The Vendors agrees to be responsible for all work performed and all expenses incurred with the project. Any subcontract arrangements must be evidenced by a written document available to the County upon request. The Vendor further agrees that the County shall not be liable to any subcontractor for any expenses or liabilities incurred under the subcontract. The Vendor, at its expense, will defend the County against such claims.

The Vendor agrees to make payments to any of its subcontractors within seven (7) working days after receipt of full or partial payments from the County in accordance with F.S. 287.0585, unless otherwise stated in the contract between the Vendor and subcontractor. The Vendor's failure to pay its subcontractor(s) within seven (7) working days will result in a penalty charged against the Vendor and paid to the subcontractor in the amount of one-half of one percent (0.50%) of the amount due per day from the expiration of the period allowed herein for payment. Such penalty shall be in addition to the actual payments owed and shall not exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the outstanding balance due.

#### **SECTION 13. Severability**

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Contract is, for any reason, held invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable by any Court of Competent Jurisdiction,

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such portion shall be deemed as a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

#### SECTION 14. Termination for Default, Fraud or Willful Misconduct

The performance of the Contract may be terminated by the County in accordance with this clause, in whole or in part, in writing, whenever the County shall determine that the Vendor has failed to meet the requirements as outlined in this Contract. Upon receipt of the written notice of termination, the Vendor shall immediately render to the County all property belonging to the County, including but not limited to, equipment, books, records, etc.

#### SECTION 15. Termination for Convenience

The County reserves the right to terminate the Contract in whole or part by giving the Vendor written notice at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of the termination. Upon receipt of written notice of termination from the County, the Vendor shall only provide those services and/or materials specifically approved or directed by the County. All other rights and duties of the parties under the Contract shall continue during such notice period, and the County shall continue to be responsible to the Vendor for the payment of any obligations to the extent such responsibility has not been excused by breach or default of the Vendor. The Vendor shall promptly contact the County to make arrangements to render to the County all property belonging to the County, including but not limited to, equipment, books, records, etc.

#### SECTION 16. Force Majeure

Neither party of this Contract shall be liable to the other for any cost or damages if the failure to perform the Contract arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the parties. Such causes may include, but are not restricted to, acts of nature, fires, quarantine restriction, strikes and freight embargoes. In all cases, the failure to perform must be totally beyond the control and without any fault or negligence of the party.

In the event of delay from the foregoing causes, the party shall take all reasonable measures to mitigate any and all resulting delay or disruption in the party's performance obligation under this Contract. If the delay is excusable under this paragraph, the delay will not result in any additional charge or cost under the Contract to either party. In the case of any delay the Vendor believes is excusable under this paragraph, the Vendor shall notify the County in writing of the delay or potential delay and describe the cause of the delay either: (1) within ten (10) calendar

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days after the cause that creates or will create the delay first arose, if the Vendor could reasonably foresee that a delay could occur as a result; or (2) within five (5) calendar days after the date the Vendor first had reason to believe that a delay could result, if the delay is not reasonably foreseeable. THE FOREGOING SHALL CONSTITUTE THE VENDOR'S SOLE REMEDY OR EXCUSE WITH RESPECT TO DELAY. Providing notice in strict accordance with this paragraph is a condition precedent to such remedy. The County, in its sole discretion, will determine if the delay is excusable under this paragraph and will notify the Vendor of its decision in writing. No claim for damages, other than for an extension of time, shall be asserted against the County. The Vendor shall not be entitled to an increase in the Contract price or payment of any kind from the County for direct, indirect, consequential, impact, or other costs, expenses or damages, including but not limited to costs of acceleration or inefficiency arising because of delay, disruption, interference, or hindrance from any cause whatsoever. If performance is suspended or delayed, in whole or in part, due to any of the causes described in this paragraph, after the causes have ceased to exist, the Vendor shall perform at no increased cost, unless the County determines, in its sole discretion, that the delay will significantly impair the value of the Contract to the County, in which case, the County may do any or all of the following: (1) accept allocated performance or deliveries from the Vendor, provided that the Vendor grants preferential treatment to the County with respect to products or services subjected to allocation; (2) purchase from other sources (with out recourse to and by the Vendor for the related costs and expenses) to replace all or part of the products or services that are the subject of the delay, which purchases may be deducted from the Contract quantity; or (3) terminate the Contract in whole or in part.

#### **SECTION 17. Access and Audits**

The Vendor shall maintain adequate records to justify all charges, expenses, and costs incurred in providing the services and materials for at least three (3) years after completion of this Contract. The County and the Clerk of Courts shall have access to such books, records, and documents as required in this Section for the purpose of inspection or audit during normal business hours, at the County's or the Clerk's cost, upon five (5) days' written notice.

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**SECTION 18. Vendor Responsibilities** 

The Vendor will provide the services and materials agreed upon in a timely and professional

manner in accordance with specifications referenced herein and in accordance with the Technical

Specifications attached here to and incorporated as Attachment B.

**SECTION 19. Public Emergencies** 

The Vendor shall agree before, during, and after a public emergency, disaster, hurricane,

tornado, flood, or other acts of nature that the County shall require a "First Priority" for services and

materials. It is vital and imperative that the majority of citizens are protected from any emergency

situation that threatens public health and safety, as determined by the County. The Vendor agrees to

sell all materials to and perform all services for the County or governmental entities on a "First

Priority" basis. The County expects to pay a fair and reasonable price for all services and materials

rendered or contracted in the event of a disaster, emergency, hurricane, tornado or other acts of nature.

SECTION 20. Period of Contract/Option to Extend or Renew

The performance period of this Contract shall begin upon full execution by the last party

to execute this Contract and terminate one (1) year from execution of contract. The parties may

renew this agreement for four (4) additional one (1) years periods with price adjustments upon

mutual written agreement between the Vendor and the County. Any Contract or amendment to the

Contract shall be subject to fund availability and mutual written agreement between the County

and the Vendor.

In the event that the Contract is continued beyond the term provided, by mutual consent,

the Contract shall be carried out on a month-to-month basis and shall not constitute an implied

renewal of the Contract. Said month-to-month extension shall be upon the same terms of the

Contract and at the compensation and payment provided herein.

**SECTION 21. Probationary Period** 

The first ninety (90) days of this Contract are to be considered a "probationary" period. At

the County's election, this Contract may be terminated, based on the performance of the Vendor,

and a new award be granted without another formal bid.

#### SECTION 22. Independent Vendor Status

Vendor and County agree that: (a) Vendor has the right to perform services for others during the term of this Contract; (b) Vendor has the sole right to control and direct the means, manner and method by which the services required by this Contract will be performed; (c) Vendor has the right to perform the services required by this Contract at any location or time; (d) Vendor has the right to hire assistants as subcontractors, or to use employees to provide the services required by this Contract.

#### **SECTION 23. Indemnification and Insurance**

Vendor shall indemnify and hold harmless County and its agents and employees from liabilities, damages, losses and costs, including but not limited to, reasonable attorney's fees, to the extent caused by the negligence, recklessness, or intentionally wrongful conduct of Vendor and any persons employed or utilized by Vendor, in the performance of the Contract.

Vendor shall maintain such commercial (occurrence form) or comprehensive general liability, workers compensation, professional liability, and other insurance as is detailed in Exhibit "1" and as is appropriate for the goods or services being performed hereunder by Vendor, its employees or agents.

#### **SECTION 24. Dispute Resolution**

The County may utilize this section, at their discretion, as to disputes regarding Contract interpretation. The County may send a written communication to the Vendor by email, overnight mail, UPS, FedEx, or certified mail. The written notification shall set forth the County's interpretation of the Contract. A response shall be provided in the same manner prior to the initial meeting with the County Manager. This initial meeting shall take place no more than twenty (20) days from the written notification of the dispute addressed to the Vendor. The Vendor should have a representative, at the meeting that can render a decision on behalf of the Vendor.

If there is no satisfactory resolution as to the interpretation of the contract, the dispute may be submitted to mediation in accordance with mediation rules as established by the Florida Supreme Court. Mediators shall be chosen by the County and the cost of mediation shall be borne by the Vendor. The Vendor shall not stop work during the pendency of mediation or dispute resolution.

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#### SECTION 25. E-Verify System

The Vendor must comply with F.S. 448.095 and use the United States Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system ("E-Verify") to verify the employment eligibility of all persons hired by the Vendor during the term of this Contract to work in Florida. Additionally, if the Vendor uses subcontractors to perform any portion of the Work (under this Contract), the Vendor must include a requirement in the subcontractor's contract that the subcontractor use E-Verify to verify the employment eligibility of all persons hired by subcontractor to perform any such portion of the work. Answers to questions regarding E-Verify as well as instructions on enrollment may be found at the E-Verify website: <a href="https://www.uscis.gov/e-verify">www.uscis.gov/e-verify</a>.

The Vendor further agrees to maintain records of its participation and compliance with the provisions of the E-Verify program, including participation by its subcontractors as provided above, and to make such records available to the County or other authorized entity consistent with the terms of the Vendor's enrollment in the program. This includes maintaining a copy of proof of the Vendor's and subcontractors' enrollment in the E-Verify program. If the Vendor enters into a contract with a subcontractor, the subcontractor must provide the Vendor with an affidavit stating that the subcontractor does not employ, contract with, or subcontract with an unauthorized alien. The Vendor shall maintain a copy of such affidavit for the duration of the Contract.

Compliance with the terms of the E-Verify program provision is made an express condition of this Contract and the County may treat a failure to comply as a material breach of the Contract. If the County terminates the Contract pursuant to F.S. 448.095(2)(c), the Vendor may not be awarded a public contract for at least one (1) year after the date on which the contract was terminated and the Vendor is liable for any additional costs incurred by the County as a result of the termination of this Contract.

#### **SECTION 26. Public Records**

The County is a public agency subject to Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. IF THE VENDOR HAS QUESTIONS REGARDING THE APPLICATION OF CHAPTER 119, FLORIDA STATUTES, TO THE VENDOR'S DUTY TO PROVIDE PUBLIC RECORDS RELATING TO THIS CONTRACT, CONTACT THE CUSTODIAN OF PUBLIC RECORDS AT (904) 530-6090,

**YULEE, FLORIDA 32097**. Under this agreement, to the extent that the Vendor is providing services to the County, and pursuant to section 119.0701, Florida Statutes, the Vendor shall:

- a. Keep and maintain public records required by the public agency to perform the service.
- b. Upon request from the public agency's custodian of public records, provide the public agency with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in this chapter or as otherwise provided by law.
- c. Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the Contract term and following completion of the Contract if the Vendor does not transfer the records to the public agency.
- d. Upon completion of the Contract, transfer, at no cost, to the public agency all public records in possession of the Vendor or keep and maintain public records required by the public agency to perform the service. If the Vendor transfers all public records to the public agency upon completion of the Contract, the Vendor shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the Vendor keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the Contract, the Vendor shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the public agency, upon request from the public agency's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the public agency.

#### **SECTION 27. Request for Records; Noncompliance**

A request to inspect or copy public records relating to a public agency's contract for materials must be made directly to the public agency. If the public agency does not possess the requested records, the public agency shall immediately notify the Vendor of the request, and the Vendor must provide the records to the public agency or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time.

If a Vendor does not comply with the public agency's request for records, the public agency shall enforce the Contract provisions in accordance with the Contract.

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A Vendor who fails to provide the public records to the public agency within a reasonable time may be subject to penalties under §119.10, Florida Statutes.

#### **SECTION 28.** Civil Action

If a civil action is filed against the Vendor to compel production of public records relating to the Contract, the Court shall assess and award against the Vendor the reasonable costs of enforcement, including reasonable attorney fees if:

- (a) The Court determines that the Vendor unlawfully refused to comply with the public records request within a reasonable time; and
- (b) At least eight (8) business days before filing the action, the plaintiff provided written notice of the public records request, including a statement that the Vendor has not complied with the request, the public agency and to the Vendor.

A notice complies with subparagraph (b), if it is sent to the public agency's custodian of public records and to the Vendor at the Vendor's address listed on its Contract with the public agency or to the Vendor's registered agent. Such notices must be sent by common carrier delivery service or by registered, Global Express Guaranteed, or certified mail, with postage or shipping paid by the sender and with evidence of delivery, which may be in an electronic format.

A Vendor who complies with a public records request within eight (8) business days after the notice is sent is not liable for the reasonable costs of enforcement.

# SECTION 29. Disclosure of Litigation, Investigations, Arbitration or Administrative Decisions

The Vendor, during the term of this Contract, or any extension, has a continual duty to properly disclose to the County Attorney, in writing, upon occurrence, all civil or criminal litigation, arbitration, mediation, or administrative proceeding involving the Vendor. If the existence of the proceeding causes the County concerns that the Vendor's ability or willingness to perform this contract is jeopardized, the Vendor may be required to provide the County with reasonable written assurance to demonstrate the Vendor can perform the terms and conditions of the Contract.

#### SECTION 30. Entire Agreement

The written terms and provisions of this Contract shall supersede all prior verbal statements of any official or other representative of the County. Such statements shall not be effective or be

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construed as entering into, or forming a part of, or altering in any manner whatsoever, this Contract or Contract Documents.

#### **Technical Specifications**

#### ATTACHMENT "B"

#### 1. Product Description

- a. All limerock material must meet the most current standard specifications for limerock base materials as described in the FDOT (Florida Department of Transportation) and bridge construction material. All limerock material must be from FDOT certified pit.
- b. The furnished limerock shall be of standard product of the manufacturer of their suppliers, be new, unused, clean and free from any defects or features affecting appearance, serviceability or the safety of the user in normal intended use.
- c. Limerock material must not contain cherty or other extremely hard pieces or lump balls or packets of sand or clay size material in sufficient quantity as to be detrimental to the proper bonding, finishing or strength or the limerock base.
- d. At least 97 percent (by weight) of the material must meet the most current specifications of FDOT Standard Specifications. All crushing or breaking-up, which might be necessary in order to meet current standards must be done before the materials are placed on the road.
- e. The successful bidder shall perform all loading. The successful bidder shall have scales to ensure proper loads.
- f. Complete description and specifications of product must accompany bid.

#### 2. Delivery

- Vendors contract shall provide delivery of requested supplies at no additional cost to the County. All associated delivery, fuel, surcharge, etc., fees shall be included in the Cost Schedule Sheet
- b. Deliveries shall be F.O.B. Destination with INSIDE DELIVERY and unloading by Vendor representative as any location within County boundaries. Delivery site may be various job sites or County facilities, as deemed necessary by County representative.
- c. All limerock shall be stockpiled before loading and allowed to drain. Moisture rates of limerock at delivery shall not exceed 15%.
- d. All materials shall be made available during the County's normal working hours and make exception to hours on an emergency basis with reasonable notice. Limerock shall be available for pickup by the County or delivery by Contractor (s).
