Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards

AGENCY: Executive Office of the President, Office of Management and Budget.

ACTION: Correcting amendment to continue delay of implementation date.

SUMMARY: The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) is updating the final guidance that appeared in the Federal Register on December 26, 2013. Guidance on the effective/applicability date is revised to allow a grace period of one additional fiscal year for non-Federal entities to implement changes to their procurement policies and procedures in accordance with guidance on procurement standards. Other requirements in the section remain unchanged.

DATES:

Effective date: May 17, 2017.
Implementation date: For all nonFederal entities, there is an additional
one-year grace period for
implementation of the procurement
stendards in 2 GFR 200,317 through
200,326. This means the grace period for
non-Federal entities extends through
December 25, 2017, and the
implementation date for the
procurement standards will start for
fiscal years beginning on or after
December 26, 2017.

Under the authority of the Chief Financial Officers Act of 1990 (31 U.S.C. 603), the Office of Management and Budget amende 2 CFR part 200 as follows:

PART 200—UNIFORM ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS, COST PRINCIPLES, AND AUDIT REQUIREMENTS FOR FEDERAL AWARDS

■ 1. The authority citation for part 200 continues to read as follows:

Authority: 31 U.S.C. 503.

■ 2. In § 200.110, revise paragraph (a) to read as follows:

§ 200.110 Effective/applicability date.

(a) The standards set forth in this part that affect the administration of Federal awards issued by Federal awarding agencies become effective once implemented by Federal awarding agencies or when any future amendment to this part becomes final. Federal awarding agoncies must implement the policies and procedures applicable to Federal awards by promulgating a regulation to be effective by December 26, 2014, unless different provisions are required by statute or approved by OMB. For the procurement standards in §§ 200.317 through 200.326, non-Federal entities may continue to comply with the procurement standards in previous OMB guidance (as reflected in § 200.104) for a total of three fiscal years after this part goes into effect. As such, the effective date for implementation of the procurement standards for non-Foderal antities will start for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2017. If a non-Pederal entity chooses to use the previous procurement standards for all or part of these three fiscal years before adopting the procurement

standards in this part, the non-Federal entity must document this decision in its internal procurement policies,

Changes to the Inspection Coverage in Official Establishments That Slaughter Fish of the Order Siluriformes

SUMMARY: The Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) is announcing and requesting comment on its plan to adjust inspection coverage at official establishments that slaughter fish of the order Silutiformes, which include catish, from all hours of operation to once per production shift.

DATES: Submit comments on or before June 16, 2017.

ADDRESSES: FSIS invites interested persons to submit comments relevant to adjusting inspection coverage as discussed and outlined in this notification. Only comments addressing the scope of this notification will be considered.

Thanks for reaching out to Glen for additional information.

During the webinar, I answered your question about use of the grace period available in 2 CFR 200.110 to use the old procurement standards located at 2 CFR Part 13.36 and 2 CFR Part 215. A non-Federal entity can use the grace period for three additional fiscal years after 2 CFR Part 200 goes into effect. The start of the fiscal year is based on the start of the fiscal year for that particular non-Federal entity.

The Uniform Rules (2 CFR Part 200) went into effect for all disaster occurring on or after December 26, 2014. The count starts at the start of the first fiscal year after December 26, 2014. Therefore, if you are using the grace period and your fiscal year starts January 1, here's how your 3 additional fiscal years would break down:

Additional Fiscal Year 1 – Jan. 1, 2015 to Dec. 31, 2016 Additional Fiscal Year 2 – Jan. 1, 2016 to Dec. 31, 2017 Additional Fiscal Year 3 – Jan. 1, 2017 to Dec. 31, 2018 10/1/15-9/30/16 41 10/1/16-9/30/17 42 10/1/17-9/30/18 43

If a non-Federal entity elects to use the grace period, it must affirmatively document this decision in its internal procurement policies, including the date upon which its grace period will end and it will accordingly transition to the new procurement standards.
